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International Filing Options

- Patent Cooperation Treaty (PCT) Application
- Paris Convention Application





PCT Application

- Intermediate International Application
- Facilitates Filing Applications in 157 Signatory States
- Two Stages:
 - International Stage
 - National Stage



PCT Application -International Stage

- Filed within 12 Months of Priority Application
- Select National Patent Office as Search Agent
 - Search of International Prior Art
- Non-Binding Opinion on Patentability
 - Industrial Application Is this something that is generally patentable
 - Novelty Has this exact invention already been invented?





PCT Application -National Stage

- File National Stage Applications Before 30-32 Month Deadline
 - Deadline Depends on Country
- Binding Substantive Examination at National Stage
 - International Search and Opinion is Influential, but Non-Binding
- Each Country/Region Prosecuted Independently



PCT Application -National Stage

Pros:

- Simplified, Streamlined Foreign Filing
- Professional Search and Opinion Before Filing in Multiple Countries
- Delays Costs for Filing in Multiple Countries
- Improves Quality of Resulting Patents

Cons:

- Increases Total Cost
- Additional Cost Usually Requires 3+ Jurisdictions for Justification
- Limited Strategic Value if Committed to Filing National Stage Applications
- Taking Full Advantage of Timing Reduces
 Period of Enforcement of Resulting
 Patent(s)



International Filing Options

- Patent Cooperation Treaty (PCT) Application
- Paris Convention Application





Paris Convention

- Filed Directly into Foreign Country No Intermediate Application
- File Paris Convention Applications within 12 Months of Priority Application



National Phase U.S. Patent Applications

- 30-month Deadline for PCT applications
 - If missed, can file Petition to Revive the Application in the U.S.
- Claims can be amended
 - Usually are to conform to U.S. claim conventions
- Written Description can be Supplemented
 - Bypass Continuation



National Phase U.S. Patent Applications — Cont.

- Evaluated for Patentability:
 - Patentable Subject Matter (§ 101)
 - Similar to Industrial Applicability
 - Novelty (§ 102)
 - Non-obviousness (§ 103)
 - Similar to Inventive Step)




Provisional Application

- Stopgap Application
- Establishes Priority Date
- Not Substantively Evaluated, <u>Cannot</u> Result in a Patent
- Non-Provisional Application must be filed within 12 months
